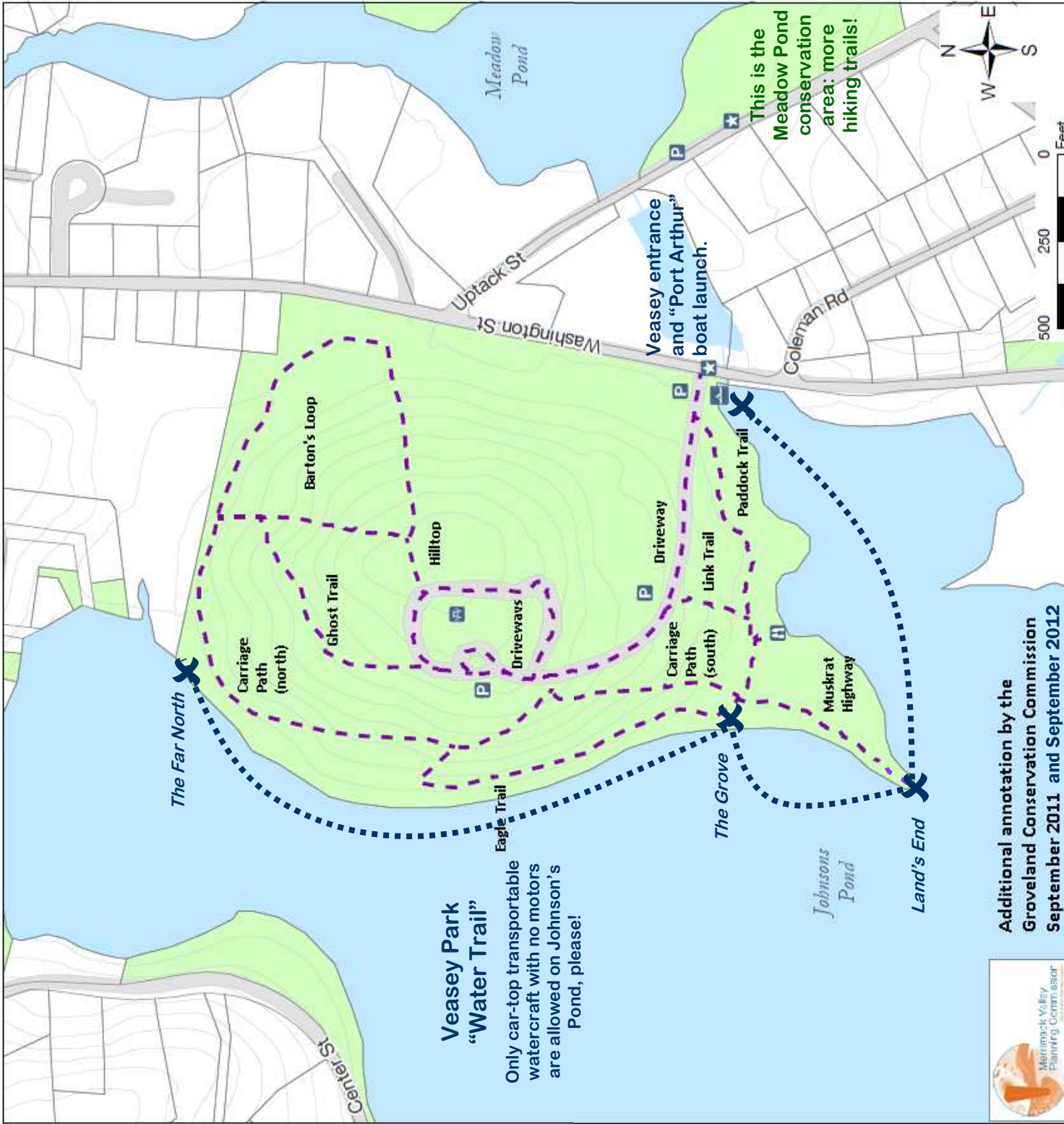
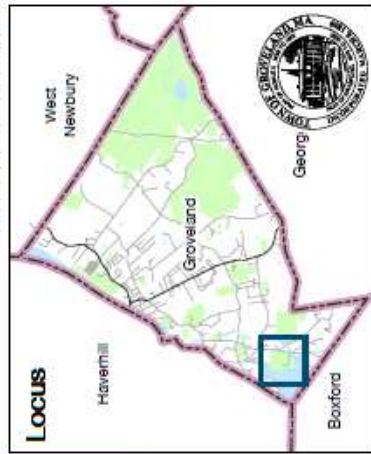

About Veasey Memorial Park

At the beginning of the last century, Arthur D. Veasey – owner of the Groveland Mills – built his summer home on this hill overlooking Johnson's Pond. The property changed hands privately for several decades after the Veasey family left, and in the 1960's the Little Missionary Sisters of Charity began their service here. They notably cared for adult women with special needs for many years.

In October 1996, the Town of Groveland bought Veasey Memorial Park from the Sisters, raising most of the purchase price through conservation grants and liens. The Veasey family, descendants of Arthur D. Veasey, made a further significant financial contribution. The Park was named in recognition of their generosity and their role in the history of the town.

The Groveland Conservation Commission now owns and operates the Park, which consists of 47.5 acres of woods and fields and nearly half a mile of freshwater shoreline on Johnson's Pond. Car top boat access is available. The property also includes several buildings that compliment and support the conservation and recreational uses of the Park. Rooms in these buildings can be privately rented for meetings or parties. Please see our website for further information <http://www.veaseypark.org>.
